HARRY EDWARD GREENE

Harry Edward Greene was born in Melrose Park, April 6, 1900, and died December 16, 1927. He was a son of Fred Greene of Osceola, Nebraska, and of Mrs. May Ebertshauser of Forest Park. The father is ill and was unable to attend the funeral.

Harry Edward Greene was a veteran of the World war, from which he emerged as a victim of shell shock. He entered the service at St. Louis, May 13, 1917, as a bugler. He was with the A. E. F., Company J, ammunition train, at Chateau-Thierry, St. Mihiel, the Argonne forest and Verdun. He was decorated with the Croix de Guerre and with the Palm Leaf of France. He received honorable discharge at Camp Grant, February 20, 1919.

In addition to his parents he is survived by 3 grand parents, Fred Greene, of Forest Park, and Mr. and Mrs. A. Rienke, of Maywood; a brother, Roy E. Greene; aunts, Mrs. A. N. King, Mrs. E. Hoffman, Mrs. Josie Wornhoff and two uncles, Fred and Edward Rienke.

The funeral was at the family home, 7729 Adams street, Tuesday afternoon. It was in charge of Rev. William Clapp of the Methodist church. Mrs. Escher sang, "Asleep in Jesus," "Beautiful Isle of Somewhere," and at the grave, "Abide With Me."

Services at Concordia cemetery were in charge of the Forest Park American Legion. Former Commander of the Legion Fred C. Becker presented the flag to the mother.

In his business life he was employed by the West Suburban Credit Rating Association as an investigator.
