

## FAITHFUL DOG KEEPS VIGIL WHERE OWNER THREW SELF IN LAKE

Highland Park, Ill., Oct. 28—Drawn to the scene by "Tiny," a wire-haired Scotch terrier who kept faithful vigil over his mistress, police today dragged the shore line of Lake Michigan, and found the body of Mrs. Alexander H. Stewart, wife of a wealthy merchant tailor.

Mrs. Stewart had been missing from her home since the middle of yesterday afternoon when she unleashed Tiny and took him for a walk. Tiny has won several prizes at dog shows.

Search was started in the evening when Stewart came home and missed his wife. Suicide was not considered until Tiny was found, shivering in the snow on a pier that juts into the lake not far from the Stewart residence. Mrs. Stewart's fur neckpiece was found at the end of the pier and her coat was found in the water.

When police arrived, Tiny gave up his vigil and started home. Just as he was crossing the last street before reaching his kennel he was run down by an automobile and killed.

Stewart said his wife had been ill almost a year and he accepted the belief that she had jumped into the lake.

### KILLED BY ROOT POISON

Collinsville, Ill., Oct. 28—The second death within a month from snake root poison was that of Edwin Kuhlman, farmer living near Pleasant Ridge. Kuhlman's entire family was ill of the poisoning. Authorities claim the epidemic, which caused 250 persons to become ill, has been checked.
